



JEWISH NATIONAL FUND OF QUEENSLAND (JNF) AGM



JNF QLD held its AGM on Wednesday 9 May 2018 at the South Brisbane Synagogue.

Dan Springer CEO of JNF Australia attended the AGM from Sydney to talk about JNF Projects in Israel and answer any queries from those in attendance about JNF activities.

At the AGM Tony Gariano stood down as JNF QLD President and David Jacobs was nominated as the new President of JNF QLD – David having been involved with JNF QLD for nearly 20 years both in his roles as Vice President and coordinator of Blue Box and Green Sunday campaigns is very familiar with all the workings of JNF QLD so a smooth transition will occur with the change of roles. Tony will stay on the executive as immediate past president filling the role of Vice President (vacated by David) together with Bruce Frey who continues in his role as JNF QLD Vice President.

David having been in Israel during 2017 as part of the JNF ANZAC mission witnessed firsthand many of the inspiring recent JNF projects in Israel and his knowledge of JNF activities will be of benefit to JNF QLD.

Also at the AGM JNF QLD stalwart Dr Eva Popper was awarded the JNF QLD 2017 Blue Box Worker of the Year which recognised Eva's dedication not only to Blue Box but to all JNF activities. Eva was not able to be at the AGM so a few days later JNF QLD committee person Lorraine Jacobs presented Eva with a certificate commemorating her award.

Earth Day in Rosh HaAyin Community Forest

KKL-JNF - 14 MAY 2018

Hundreds of Israeli children and their families celebrate International Earth Day in the Rosh HaAyin Community Forest in central Israel. Due to unseasonable rainstorms that took place on the original planned date, the event was held two weeks later on Friday May 11.

Every year, Earth Day is observed around the world on April 22, to raise awareness of each person's ability to influence his or her surroundings by taking the environment into consideration in their everyday behavior, for their own sakes and for that of future generations. Earth Day also demonstrates that efficient resource consumption affects the wellbeing of the entire ecosystem and the environment.

In Israel, KKL-JNF celebrated International Earth Day on Friday May 11 in the [Rosh HaAyin Community Forest](#) adjacent to the city of Rosh HaAyin. Hundreds of children and their families took part in the event that was bringing environmental issues to the forefront of the public agenda. The participants joined an estimated one billion people in 192 countries around the world who participated in Earth Day activities this year. Ironically, due to the unseasonable and unusual heavy rainstorms that took place in Israel on the prescribed date, the event was delayed by two weeks.

Neta Mizrachi, KKL-JNF Community and Forest Coordinator in the lowlands region, explained the concept of a KKL-JNF Community Forest:

"A community forest is a model for connecting the community to the nearby forest through activities, trips, events, and recruiting local forest trustees and volunteers. Over the years, KKL-JNF has developed a number of community forests throughout the country, such as the Rosh HaAyin Forest. Around the world, the forest belt surrounding built-up areas is considered very important and is considered an essential environmental resource for the quality of life of the residents. Community Forests serve mainly the residents of the communities nearby. KKL-JNF, together with the Local Authority and the community, connects



the population to the forest, which is an ideal place for wonderful educational and social activities, regardless of class and culture. In a number of significant events, including Earth Day. The Rosh Ha'ayin Forest has a team of volunteers that operate throughout the year, in coordination with the Rosh Ha'Ayin municipality and KKL-JNF, and run a number of significant events, including Earth Day."

It was a beautiful Friday morning and the large clearing in the Rosh HaAyin Forest was a hive of activity, with performances by young musicians from the local music conservatory and some 26 activity stations manned by local 5th and 6th grade schoolchildren, youth movements and a host of other organizations including KKL-JNF. The theme of the event centered on the problems of climate change and the ways to battle the phenomenon. Each station dealt with a different subject of ecology in a way that was both educational and entertaining. For example, one station dealt with recycling waste material.

The message of that station was: "Recycling helps to reduce energy usage, reduce the consumption of fresh raw materials, reduce air pollution and water pollution and in the long run helps tackle climate change".

Another station demonstrated the problems caused by the wide use of non-biodegradable plastic bags.

The message there was: "Plastic shopping bags have become a major problem in our country. If you must use one – choose a bag you already have and reuse it over and over again."

Yet another station run by the local Afek School was called "Global Warming in Rosh HaAyin". Using a collection of hi-tech measuring systems, the pupils



explained to residents how global warming was affecting their very own quality of life. Young Gil Adir showed how carbon dioxide concentration decreased drastically in the forest, compared to the much higher figure inside the city. The answer, he said, lies in the presence of trees. "A single tree absorbs some 20 tons of harmful carbon dioxide from the environment per year while releasing about 700 kg of clean oxygen for breathing. Our solution is simple – we need to plant more trees."

A Rosh HaAyin resident who was listening remarked that somebody should calculate how much oxygen the trees planted by KKL-JNF have contributed to the country.

Standing nearby and brimming with pride as she watched pupils Noam and Mia deliver an explanation about climate change was Dr. Nigist Mengesha, who heads the Education portfolio in the Rosh HaAyin Municipality. "I am so happy that the schools under my jurisdiction have taken on the task of teaching about ecology and sustainability, and that the youngsters themselves find it important to promote these values to the general public for the benefit of all."

Three KKL-JNF stations, in the form of enormous board games, were also situated in the forest clearing to teach sustainability and ecology. They were manned by KKL-JNF guides Yuval Shvatzvald and Rina Margel.

Residents of Rosh HaAyin believe that it is not by chance that the main Earth Day event in Israel took place in their city. Deputy Mayor of Rosh HaAyin Sigal Sheinman, who is also a member of the city's environmental committee, said that Rosh Ha'ayin is Israel's most active city in environmental issues.

"We have a very busy environmental forum on the city council. People from all over the world come to visit the Afek Ecological School. We have a kindergarten that recently won the country's recycling prize after they collected 58,000 used bottles and cans. Our relationship with KKL-JNF is extensive and far-reaching as part of our "green agenda". Let us not forget that this whole event is taking place in our very own KKL-JNF Community Forest."



The Rosh HaAyin Forest was the first KKL-JNF forest to be designated a community forest. KKL-JNF's Netta Mizrahi said that KKL-JNF considers the connection between a community and its forest of prime importance.

"The communities' activities are led by local Forest Trustees in coordination with KKL-JNF on the one hand and the City Council on the other. This status means that local residents have a say in the character and in the upkeep of their forest for themselves and for future generations. They also usually insist that the forest remains authentic and primal without coffee shops and ice cream stands."

Rosh HaAyin Forest Trustee Talya Smolash explained how the idea of the [community forest](#) came to Israel from Europe and how it was introduced to KKL-JNF.

"It began in 2004 when Rosh HaAyin resident Moshe Shaler, who was also a KKL-JNF employee, decided that the European model of Community Forests would work in Israel. We formed a committee to promote the idea. He was the driving force behind the project and our "foot in the door" at KKL-JNF. The idea was quickly accepted and became a huge success. On weekends, this forest is packed with visitors. The concept has since been adopted successfully in several other KKL-JNF forests around the country."

At one of the stations, Director General of the City of Rosh HaAyin Shlomo Shilo was seen having an intense discussion with pupils from the Afek School about climate change. When asked about the origin of his impressive climatology knowledge, he said that during his army service he had to take an advanced climatology course as part of his service in an elite IDF unit. He also said that Earth Day in Rosh HaAyin is the climax of the ecological activities that are carried out through the year.

"This day portrays what I call the compass of Rosh HaAyin. It points to where we want to go, and the direction we are following, in our schools and in afterschool activities. Today I can happily say that we have much to be proud of, and much to be thankful for, in our relationship with KKL-JNF".

We will start our walk at Nachal Tzin continuing to Hod Akev and Ein Akev, finishing the day's walk by hiking down to Ein Ovdad, Ben Gurion's grave Midrasha & Tzin Wadi. Visit JNF projects at Yeurcham + Yerucham Park.

Day 3 - Tuesday 30th October 2018

Today we will trek through the Ramon Crater to Colombia Lookout, located on Ramon Mountain. Mount Ramon is a mountain in the Negev desert in Israel, near the Egyptian border and west of the well-known Ramon Crater. Its elevation is 1,037 metres (3,402 ft) above sea level and it is the summit of the Negev Mountains. It is the highest mountain in the Southern District (Israel).

We will go down to the crater through the Prism Canyon and after lunch we will hike up to Arod and Oded Mountains.



Afternoon we will visit the Nitzana youth village.

In the Negev desert close to Egypt's border, the Nitzana Educational Eco-Village nestles amid the sand dunes. Numerous groups of children and young people from all over Israel come to the village to engage in a variety of educational activities connected mainly to Zionism, ecology, nature, the environment and the desert.

Dinner at the Hotel

Day 4 - Wednesday 31st October 2018

6:00 breakfast 7:00 Depart hotel

The day will commence with a visit to the Be'er-Sheva ANZAC Memorial Centre, followed by a ceremony in honour of 101 years since the Australian Light Horsemen liberated Be'er-Sheva. We will recognise the contribution of these brave soldiers towards the creation of a Jewish State and the ongoing friendship between Australia and Israel.

In the afternoon we will visit Ashalim. The BrightSource-GE-NOY Megalim project is one of 3 projects selected under Israel's Ashalim 250 megawatt total solar tender. It will be located on Plot B and feature BrightSource's concentrating solar power tower technology. More than 50,000 computer-controlled heliostats, or mirrors, track the sun on two axis and reflect sunlight onto a boiler on top of a 250-meter tower. When operational, the Ashalim Solar Thermal Power Station will help Israel achieve its goal of having 10 percent of its electricity production from renewable energy sources by 2020.

Dinner at the Hotel

Day 5 - Thursday 1st November 2018

6:00 breakfast 7:00 Depart hotel

On the last day of our hike we will trek through the Ramon Crater to Mount Saharonim and Nekarot.

Makhtesh Ramon is a geological feature of Israel's Negev desert. Located at the peak of Mount Negev, some 85 km south of the city of Beersheba, the landform is not actually an impact crater from a meteor nor a volcanic crater formed by a volcanic eruption, but rather is the world's largest Makhtesh (crater). The crater is 40 km long, 2-10 km wide and 500 metres deep, and it is shaped like an elongated heart. The only settlement in the area is the small town of Mitzpe Ramon located on the northern edge of the crater. Today the crater and surrounding area forms Israel's largest national park, the Ramon Nature Reserve.





PASSING OF LEWIS RISCHIN

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing on 1st May 2018 of Mr Lewis Rischin, late of Lulworth House nursing home in Sydney, NSW. He was aged 92.

Lewis would be well known to many of you. He was a World War 2 veteran and after discharge from the Navy in 1946, met local lass Rachel Soloduhin (deceased 1979) who was studying at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, and married her in Brisbane in 1948. They lived in Coorparoo until 1975. They had two children Susan and Danny. Lewis was a taxi driver for Blue and White cabs for many years, and during this time he served on the Jewish Board of Deputies as President, collected for the JNF, and, like most families in Brisbane, offered to billet competing athletes when it was Brisbane's turn to host the Maccabi Games.

Lewis also convened the annual Legacy picnic hosting disadvantaged children on an annual trip to the bay side suburbs of Wynnum and Manly under Police escort.

From 1968 to 1972 Lewis fulfilled his lifelong dream of owning and operating a ferry service from Manly to Dunwich on North Stradbroke Island. In conjunction with Norn Dunn Bus Lines, he also managed a tourism operation to St Helena Island where tours of the old penal settlement were conducted. It was a great day when Channel 9 covered the launch of the boat at Bulimba on the banks of the Brisbane River. In 1970 Lewis met the Queen's ship, the Britannia, at the mouth of the Brisbane River and followed her at close quarters all the way to the terminal alongside Kingsford Smith Drive.

In the years that followed, Lewis's wife Rae suffered declining health, and after selling the boat to Hayles Canberra Cruises in 1972, Lewis spent some time in the real estate industry. They built a house at Paradise Point on the Gold Coast where it was hoped they would retire. Sadly, in 1979, Rae passed away and Lewis sold the property. He moved into a unit in Surfers Paradise and became involved with the local Gold Coast Jewish Community, helping out around the shule with odd jobs and general gardening and maintenance work.

Lewis met his second partner Clarice (a recently widowed lady he had known in Sydney during his teenage years) in the mid 1980's and together they travelled extensively around Australia and overseas visiting Israel, Europe and the United Kingdom while also tracing some family history. Lewis also enjoyed catching up with his old shipmates from the Corvette Echuca travelling to that Victorian town every two years around Anzac Day to honour those who had paid the ultimate sacrifice.

In 2013 Lewis had a major operation following which he was no longer able to care for Clarice who was then moved to Sydney by her family. During an attempted visit by car to see Clarice in April 2014, Lewis suffered a bad accident at Ulmarra, around half way, and was confined to the Coffs Harbour Hospital for many weeks. Susan and Danny decided Lewis could no longer look after himself and so he spent the next 4 years in the nursing home in Sydney where he eventually succumbed to various illnesses which included a bad fall shortly before he passed away.

Lewis's remembrance and funeral service were conducted at the Jewish Chapel in Rookwood Cemetery in Sydney. It was presided over by Rabbi David Freedman (Bondi Central Synagogue) and Roger Selby, President of NAJEX, NSW.

Lewis will be remembered by his family and those who knew him, as a person of great courage, strength, determination and an honest and forthright approach to life.

He is survived by his sister Mrs Phyllis Glasser, his two children Susan and Danny, his daughter-in-law Pearl, 3 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.

We wish all of Lewis's family members long life and only happy times ahead with treasured memories of a loved father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother and uncle.

When do you register?

You don't have to wait to be in Year 10. Register students earlier (from Year 6 onwards) so they don't miss out on valuable information and opportunities to meet their peers.

How do you access the funds?

Funds are paid directly to the program provider. Once you are accepted into a program, you automatically receive a \$5,000 reduction in the cost.

Help us find other parents and grandparents of eligible students.

Each year on average there are an estimated 500 eligible year 10 students who can participate in an Israel program. The majority are in various public and private schools outside of Emanuel, Masada and Moriah. Not all of them identify themselves as being Jewish. That does not mean they can't go. We want them to learn about their culture and find their own link to their heritage.
