## **Remembrance Day Annual Pilgrimage to the Lutwyche Cemetery Sunday 11th November 2018 at 11.00 am (Please assemble by 10.45am)**

Each year to mark Remembrance Day the Queensland Association of Jewish Ex-Service Men & Women and communal friends attend a special Service at the Gravesites of Jewish Servicemen who died while serving during the 2nd World War & who are buried at Lutwyche Cemetery in Brisbane. As decades have passed since 1945 fewer & fewer Jewish Ex-Service Men & Women are available to attend this Service to pay tribute to those Jewish service personnel who gave the supreme sacrifice during the World Wars & other conflicts.

**QAJEX appeals to you to attend this year's Annual Pilgrimage to the Lutwyche Cemetery on Sunday the 11th of November commencing at 11.00am sharp. This is the first time in many years that we will be commemorating Remembrance Day on the actual date. This year is the 100th anniversary.**

### **Remembrance Day, 11 November**

*Originally called Armistice Day, this day commemorated the end of the hostilities for the Great War (World War I), the signing of the armistice, which occurred on 11 November 1918 (the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month). Armistice Day was observed by the Allies as a way of remembering those who died, especially soldiers with 'no known grave'.*

*After the end of World War II in 1945, the Australian and British Governments changed the name to Remembrance Day as an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all war dead. In October 1997, then Governor-General of Australia, Sir William Deane, issued a proclamation declaring:*

*"11 November as Remembrance Day and urging Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11.00 am on Remembrance Day each year to remember the sacrifice of those who died or otherwise suffered in Australia's cause in wars and war-like conflicts.*



## Growing Desert Communities through Innovation

JNF - 21 OCTOBER 2018

***On the fourth day of their mission, the JNF Australia delegation visited the Negev, where they witnessed life in the thriving secular-religious community of Sheizaf and dedicated a new playground in Nitzanei Sinai near the Egyptian border. They then continued on to the Arava, where they saw desert agriculture in action. Before setting out, the delegation got an unexpected bitter taste of the security station on the Gaza Border, where projects that were on their itinerary to visit were cancelled due to escalations from the Gaza strip.***

The visit of the [JNF Australia](#) Delegation to southern Israel was an opportunity for a genuine encounter with the complex reality of living on the Gaza border – even before they set out for the [Negev](#). A ceremony scheduled to be held in an elementary school in Sderot was canceled due to the security situation. Studies were cancelled that day in many cities in the south, following rocket fire from the Gaza Strip and a missile strike that hit a house in Beer Sheva. The visit to The Park of Courage (*Park HaGvura*) in Sderot, which JNF Australia is helping to establish, was also postponed due to security considerations.

### **Sheizaf: A shared life**

The delegation kicked off the day in Ramat Negev (Negev Highlands), where they met **Eran Doron**, head of the Regional Council. “I’m happy to have the opportunity to

show you the new things that are happening here. The ties with our friends in Australia have brought about a change in the Ramat Negev. Strengthening this region impacts the entire country. Together, we promise to continue the settlement of the Negev”.

Delegates toured the construction site of a new high school, located next to the Council building. From the new school, they continued on foot to [Sheizaf](#), a new community of secular and religious residents wishing to embark on a shared life together. [JNF Australia](#) has [adopted Sheizaf](#) and supports the development of the infrastructure required to build homes and public buildings.

Sheizaf’s founding group is comprised of 15 families that currently live in trailers, in a temporary camp. Infrastructure works for the construction of 13

additional homes have already begun, with the support of JNF Australia. KKL-JNF Israel has also joined the effort, and supports the groundwork, the paving of roads and the development of the entrance to Sheizaf. "I came here to live in a joint **community** of religious and secular people," said Dafi Adler. "Whenever we can, we go to see the progress of the development work with our own eyes, and find it incredible that it is really happening." At the end of the visit, a cornerstone was laid for the new residential neighborhood.

From Sheizaf, the delegation continued to Tlalim, where a new park is under construction - also with the support of JNF Australia. The park will include playground facilities, a **bicycle trail**, green areas and seating areas. The park is scheduled to be completed by April, and the tractors were hard at work to meet the target.

### Nitzanei Sinai: Family atmosphere

Near the Egyptian border, in the Nitzanei Sinai (Kadesh Barnea) community, a donation from the estate of Erika and Allan Manning of Sydney has enabled the construction of a playground. A group of local residents came to welcome the guests, including kindergarten children, who enjoyed playing in the new playground, and then sang and danced for the guests from overseas.

Amir Peleg, the community's chairperson and a farmer who grows cherry tomatoes, said that he has made the community his home with his wife and five children: "Ten years ago, there was nothing here, but our community is growing and developing," he said. He added that the new playground was not only a play area for the children, but also a meeting place for their parents.

Local resident Efrat Gilboa is the granddaughter of Victor Fonda, the former president of JNF Australia. "There is no greater joy than hearing the laughter of children playing in a playground," she said. "By choosing to live here in the **desert**, I feel that I am fulfilling my grandfather's dreams."

If further proof is needed of the warm, family atmosphere between the residents of Nitzanei Sinai

and their Australian friends, **Hila Kaplan**, a mushroom grower who lives in Nitzanei Sinai with her husband and three daughters, invited everyone to lunch at her home.

At the end of the visit to the Ramat Negev region, the entire delegation visited the grave of **David Ben-Gurion** in Sde Boker and laid a wreath in memory of the man whose vision led to settling the Negev and conquest of the desert conditions.

### The Arava: Where agriculture meets Zionism

The group continued to Moshav Ein Yahav in the Arava, home to the Ben HaShitin (Between the Lines) Association for the Advancement of Education. The association's projects, supported by JNF Australia, include a number of pre-military preparatory (*mechina*) programs and the "Hebrew Labor" project, which promotes the work of Israelis in agriculture.

"We could not have done all this without your help," Ben HaShitin Director General **Avishai Berman** told the guests. He presented the association's vision for nurturing a generation of young people active and motivated by a sense of mission and responsibility for Israeli society and the Zionist vision. He emphasized: "Our goal is to generate a regional change".

Four *mechina* students met with the visitors to describe their life together, their studies, volunteering and agricultural work. **Ido Buchman** made aliyah to Israel from the Netherlands directly to the *mechina* program. "I didn't feel at home when I was not in Israel," he said. "I knew that the program would help me connect to Israel before enlisting in the army. We learn about ourselves and understand what it means to be Jews and Israelis."

"I wanted to live in the desert, a place so very different from my home," said **Daniel Frankenthal**, who came to the school from Givat Ada. "The moment I arrived, I fell in love with the place."

**Rachel Talkar**, who came from a religious family in Hashmonaim, said: "It's amazing that we can live here together and get to know one another."

The last stop of the day was in the greenhouses of Moshav Hatzeva, where **Michal Meltzer** told them about the farm that was established with the support of JNF Australia, within the framework of the Hebrew Labor project, in order to enable visitors to experience agricultural work. The farm grows tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, cabbages, cauliflower, onions and a variety of other vegetables. "It is very important to us that people visit us and get to know the Arava," she said.

**Noga Ansis**, a participant in the Hebrew Labor project, said she wanted to experiment with agriculture, because it is such unique and exceptional work. "It's exciting to grow vegetables, to see how the plants develop and to eat vegetables we raised ourselves."

"When you work in the field and get your hands dirty, you feel an inseparable part of the land," said **Ido Bitran**, also taking part in Hebrew Labor.

"The communities we met today represent the essence of the JNF," concluded **Dan Springer**, CEO of JNF Australia. "This partnership enables us to realise our Zionism."

## MITZVAH DAY – YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Mitzvah Day is an annual event where individuals and groups of all ages and abilities around Australia and internationally, join together to spend one day volunteering in a variety of activities (that we call Projects). Groups and individuals arrange their own Projects which are chosen and organised entirely by each volunteer group.

This year will be the 8th annual Mitzvah Day in Australia and will occur on Sunday 18 November 2018. Affiliated with Mitzvah Day International which was launched in the UK in 2008, the movement has grown so that in 2017, over 40,000 people in 24 countries participated. In Australia last year, we had 60 volunteer groups organising 80 diverse activities that took place around the country and involved over 3,000 people.

How it works – Organisation or individuals develop a mitzvah they will perform on Mitzvah Day. When you register the Project on our website, we send you a Welcome Pack and free merchandise including our good looking and distinctive green t-shirts to wear on the day, stickers, balloons plus support from us.

Mitzvah Day brings the community together, young and old and from many diverse backgrounds. We see reducing hardship and poverty, helping the environment and bringing joy through volunteering with an emphasis on supporting existing charities and building stronger communities, as good community qualities that should be encouraged.

**Each year we have had great support in Melbourne, Perth and Sydney and some Projects registered in Adelaide and Brisbane. JNF Queensland with their clean-up of the Mt Gravatt Jewish Cemetery in Brisbane have been affiliated with Mitzvah Day for several years but we would love to increase participation in Queensland. We encourage individuals, groups of friends, youth groups, shules, sporting groups and any other Jewish organisation to create or joining in a Mitzvah Day Project for 2018.**

Some of the Projects that are already registered for this year include cooking, collect-a thons and packing care packs for Aboriginal communities in remote areas. Interstate, Projects include distributing meals for residents of public housing; a “Bra drive” for the Uplift Project; wrapping Christmas presents for donation to children living in women's refuges from family violence; concerts at local Jewish nursing homes; preparing floral bouquets for nursing home residents and visiting seniors with the volunteers’ furry friends (dogs) for a pat, play and conversation!

There are 3 easy steps to become involved:

1. Create or join a Project – this can be by choosing a charity that interests you. Make contact to enquire how you could provide help. This could include a clean-up of their premises, collection or distribution of goods, or receipt of a hot meal.

## AN ACT OF DEFIANCE



In this riveting historical drama, 10 political activists (including Nelson Mandela and his inner circle of Black and Jewish supporters) face a possible death sentence for conspiracy to commit sabotage after they are arrested by the apartheid South African government during a raid in the town of Rivonia during the summer of 1963. Bram Fischer (exceptionally played by Peter Paul Muller), a sympathetic lawyer, risks his career and freedom to defend these men, attempting to hide the fact that he, too, frequently convened on the farm where they were arrested.



## Ask the Rabbi GUN CONTROL

### Q. Should people be prohibited from having guns?

A. Guns have wrought immense harm in the United States and elsewhere in the hands of people on a rampage. Hundreds of innocent victims have been killed and hundreds wounded.

Whatever the perpetrators' motives they have made normal life like going to school and shule vulnerable and unsafe. There can be no justification for imperilling or destroying human life: everyone, young or old, must be able to "sit under their vine or fig tree with none to make them afraid" (Micah 4:4). Wanton killing is the worst crime there is (Exodus 20:13), even if it is unpremeditated (Numbers 35:11).

The problem with guns is threefold:

1. The gun, which is the symbol of all means of doing harm.

In Jewish law a person must not own a dangerous dog (Bava Kamma 79a). If one owns a dangerous dog it must be kept under restraint at all times (Choshen Mishpat 409:3). Even a dog that is unlikely to do harm must be kept under restraint because it can frighten people (Shabbat 63b).

Hence it is best that nobody should own a gun and if they do they must keep it under restraint. Not only guns but all potential means of harm must be identified and dealt with as if they were guns, though it is admitted that guns seem to have a worse potential for harm than many other means of damage.

2. The motivation: society must train its members to be law-abiding and peaceful and not use violence even if they are aggrieved or angry. In the long term, therefore, moral education must aim for good citizenship.

In the meantime perpetrators of harm must be harshly punished in order to deter themselves and others from acts of violence. The suggestion made below that gun-owners should voluntarily discipline themselves by means of regular checks will enhance this deterrence.

3. The potential victim: A person must not place him- or herself in a position of danger (Deuteronomy 22:8) and since schoolchildren are now seen to be especially vulnerable, society must protect them as firmly as possible (e.g. by security measures). Society must remove or prevent any safety hazard (Bava Kamma 15b).

The community as a whole has this responsibility because no-one should "stand idly by when your fellow's blood is shed" (Leviticus 19:16). This recommendation does not imply that teachers should be armed. That would be an irrelevant "quick fix".

Some gun owners will insist that they have valid reasons to possess weapons. This may have an element of validity but there is still something that they can do.

Acknowledging that other gun owners are a threat to others, "decent" gun owners must exercise self-discipline and allow themselves and their genuine motives to be placed on a register and be regularly monitored. Fair's fair and this is something they can do to alleviate the problem.


